Project Type: Greenway Project & Expanding Local Tourism

Lake Junaluska Overlook & Connector Trail:

Haywood TDA One-Time Project Funds will go towards Phase 1 of this project, which is building an overlook and connecting trail. Phase 1 includes creating an overlook that will become a tourist destination point (see attached drawing). Guests from the Terrace Hotel will be able to walk out of the hotel to a beautiful vantage point overlooking the lake. Then, they will be able to walk down a pathway that will lead into the scenic Susanna Wesley Garden. The pathway will extend to the new entrance of the Warren Center, creating a safe and scenic walkway from lodging accommodations to newly renovated event space. The Overlook will become a destination point in its own right. Both overnight visitors and day visitors will enjoy its viewpoint. The connector trail will also be utilized by a wide-range of visitors to the grounds, improving the experience of tourists who visit.

13. Does a similar project already exist in Western North Carolina or Haywood County?

A visit to Lake Junaluska is a unique Haywood County experience. While lakes, mountains, hotels, hiking trails, walking paths, golf courses, and event venues are found throughout Haywood County, there is nowhere else in Haywood County where all of those things are located in the same place.

This project will attract visitors because it will enhance the overall guest experience at Lake Junaluska and will make it a more appealing destination, especially for event planners who are looking for a walkable destination with lodging and event space located within close proximity to one another. Creating an intentional pathway between the Terrace Hotel and the Warren Center is an essential part of increasing room nights at the Terrace Hotel.

Once the renovations to the Warren Center are complete, the venue will provide multi-purpose event space with catering capabilities. It will be an ideal location for weddings, wedding receptions, conference gatherings, banquets, family reunions, award ceremonies, lectures, educational events, etc. Guests will be able to conveniently walk between lodging at the Terrace Hotel and their specific event. (Imagine an entire wedding party and guests staying at the Terrace Hotel for a weekend wedding event held at the Warren Center. Or, envision a state-wide organization hosting a banquet and events in the Warren Center while reserving the entire Terrace Hotel for several week nights.)

Additionally, this project will beautify the grounds for all visitors to enjoy. Lake Junaluska is known for its walking trail that encircles the lake. The overlook and connector trail will tie into the pathways that lead into the Susanna Wesley Garden as well as the Lake Junaluska Rose Walk.

With TDA One-Time Project Fund support, the addition of this new overlook and connector trail combined with the unique setting will create additional leisure room nights and draw more tourists to this one-of-a kind mountain lake destination.

14. Will this project include a marketing plan?

This project will include a marketing plan. Lake Junaluska will invest \$42,000 annually on campaigns that reach audiences who live more than 50 miles away from Haywood County, including paid social media posts, Visit NC digital advertising, Romantic Asheville digital advertising, TripAdvisor Sponsored ads, targeted e-news campaigns and ads in regional visitors guides. We will also pitch Lake Junaluska stories and events to regional media outlets such as NC Weekend, Tar Heel Traveler and Our State Magazine, as well as to travel writers and influencers to gain television, digital and print coverage. We will also market the new overlook, connector trail and event center to group planners, wedding planners and event planners throughout the region.

The Warren Center will ultimately be a venue for private bookings, whether for a wedding reception, banquet for up to 240 people, educational lecture, family or organizational gathering, etc. Many of the guests utilizing the venue will be walking over from the Terrace Hotel. The Susanna Wesley Garden will additionally be another reason for our leisure guests to use the connector trail. The views at the top of the connector are sure to be some of the best views in the area.

The number of guests expected to use the trail are estimated below.

Year 1:

20 Wedding Receptions with weddings on the outdoor lawn – Varies in size from 75 – 200 people each event (Currently in 2022, we will have approximately 60 wedding events. We estimate that approximately 33% of these will use The Warren Center for their wedding/reception).

10 Group Dinner events - 150 - 200 guests for each event (from groups we book who want to rent The Warren Center for their private dinner event).

1 – 2 Proms for 150 – 250 people

Leisure guests utilizing the trail – 1500 – 2500 people

Total number of guests walking on the connector trail – 7,325 people during the first year

28 Wedding Receptions with weddings on the outdoor lawn – varying in size from 75 – 200 people each event

15 Group Dinner events – 150 – 200 people

1 – 2 Proms – 150 – 250 people

Leisure Guests utilizing the trail – 2500 – 5000 people











Scales 1:200,000




